

Policy concerning students requesting a reduced timetable or to drop a subject for the current academic year

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Introduction

This document is to inform parents and students of the process for students requesting to follow a reduced timetable or drop a subject.

Students eligible for a reduced timetable

Students are given a reduced timetable under the following circumstances:

- For serious academic issues such as: •
 - Moving from Year 5 to Year 6 the student has achieved a Grade 'C' (below Grade '5') in a 0 number of subjects, which restricts their option choices.
 - Moving from Year 6 to 7 the student has below a Grade 'D' in several End of Year 6 0 examinations.
 - Please note: Students with less than a Grade 'D' in a Year 6 subject cannot continue to Year 7 A-level without the consent of the Head of Department

Note: The student's attendance, attitude, and motivation will be considered in making such decisions.

- A subject, which is normally offered by the School, is not available due to small numbers or timetable clashes, resulting in the student taking it outside the School.
- For serious academic and/or pastoral reasons.

Note: All cases will be viewed individually on their own merits. The final decision will be at the Headmaster's discretion and will be binding on the student and their parents.

Students are not allowed a reduced timetable under the following circumstances:

- If they are doing extra IGCSEs or A-Levels, IAL's or other subjects/activities outside the school, of their own choosing.
- They are doing their Maths in an unorthodox way and not in the way expected by the Mathematics Department, e.g. following the IAL programme.

Additional notes:

- Students in Years 1 to 5 are not allowed reduced timetables and must attend their full program of • timetabled lessons. The only exception is if they qualify for special consideration due to serious academic/pastoral issues which have been known to the School for at least one academic year prior to the request. In these special cases, non-exam students will need to follow the full program of lessons in the given subject until the end of the academic year.
- All requests should be made to Ursula Pantelides, Senior Assistant Head (ursula.pantelides@englishschool.ac.cy) who will also consult with Pastoral colleagues.



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Note: Year 5 students requesting to become non-exam students will continue with their normal lessons until after they have completed the whole Year 5 course. Students who fail to complete the full academic programme for their year of study, will not be eligible for school prizes in that year.
