A Day at the Thermal Baths

In a quiet corner of north-west Spain, there are magical <u>thermal</u> baths. Imagine a grassy riverbank with round-ish pools, surrounded by trees. The water is warm and soothing. It feels like a special place, even though it's thousands of miles away from Japan.

The baths are called Outariz and Burga de Canedo. They have six warm pools and two cold ones. A curved metal footbridge connects them. Today, there are hardly any people here, and the best part is that it's free to use!

Before I found out about these baths, I didn't even know this place existed. But now, I'm melting into the thermal waters, feeling relaxed and happy.

On my way back, I pass wise-looking trees, pretty red flowers, and even some birds by the river. It's a <u>peaceful</u> journey, and the sound of the flowing river drowns out the noise of nearby cars.

I stop to rinse my mouth with warm water from a blue fountain. It's on a wooden deck overlooking the river. Then I walk past some pretty but <u>waterlogged</u> baths. They're called Chavasqueira thermal baths. Next, I cross an <u>impressive</u> old Roman bridge. Finally, I arrive in Ourense's old town.

As I swill the thermal water, I feel its gentle warmth. The Fonte do Tinteiro fountain stands alone on a wooden deck, its blue water reflecting the sky. Nearby, the Chavasqueira thermal baths, although waterlogged due to winter, still hold their <u>charm</u>. The Ponte Romana, an ancient Roman bridge, spans the river, connecting the past to the present. And now, I'm here in Ourense's old town, where history whispers through every cobblestone street.
