Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

Welcome to the 2026–2027 academic year at The English School. I hope you have all enjoyed a restful and enjoyable summer and that our students return refreshed and ready for the year ahead. I offer a particularly warm welcome to those students and parents who are new to the school this year.

This will be my first full academic year as Headmaster and I am excited about what lies ahead. Since joining in January, I have spent a great deal of time listening, learning and getting to know the English School and its wider community. This has confirmed what I already believed: The English School is a very special place, with a proud history, many considerable strengths and enormous potential.

During the summer term, we developed a clear School Action Plan, informed by my observations and the views shared with me during my first six months, as well as the considerable data and evidence available to us. Central to our plan is strengthening the School's culture. We want The English School to be a place where high standards are clearly understood and consistently upheld; where students are safe, respectful and kind; and where learning is purposeful and free from unnecessary distraction. We will therefore place renewed emphasis on behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform. We are also strengthening and extending our existing mobile-phone policies as we move towards becoming a mobile-free campus.

Academic ambition will, of course, remain at the heart of the School. We will continue to provide a challenging curriculum and excellent preparation for examinations and university applications. At the same time, we want education at The English School to extend well beyond examination results. We will develop our super and co-curricular provision to create further opportunities for students to become curious, independent and confident learners.

We will also relaunch the House system across the School, creating more opportunities for participation, leadership and healthy competition, while strengthening students' sense of identity and belonging.

None of this can be achieved by the School alone. A strong partnership between home and school is essential, and I look forward to working openly and constructively with parents throughout the year.

Above all, I want every student to feel proud to belong to The English School and to make the most of the many opportunities available here. I look forward to welcoming everyone back and to a positive, purposeful and successful year for our whole community.

Introduction to Engage

Engage is The English School's online Parent Portal. It gives parents secure access to important information about their child's school life, including attendance, reports, school notices, activities, trips, documents and parent-teacher appointments.

Parents should use Engage regularly to:

- read official school notices
- view published academic reports and assessment information
- check attendance and lateness records
- access documents shared by the school
- complete online forms, including absence notes and consent forms
- book parent-teacher appointments when bookings are open
- update contact information where required

To support clearer and more effective communication, we are introducing a more streamlined approach to how routine school information is shared. For the 2026–2027 academic year, parents will continue to receive an email notification whenever a new Engage Notice is published. These email notifications will direct parents to their Engage Notices, where the full communication can be accessed. From January 2027 onwards, email notifications for routine Engage Notices will cease, and parents are encouraged to regularly check their Engage inbox to stay up to date.

Some information appears only after it has been officially published by the school. Certain sections may also update at specific times of the day or term. If a section appears empty, this usually means that no information has been released yet.

Parents can access Engage through the Parent Portal using a desktop computer, tablet or mobile phone. Engage can also be added as a shortcut to a phone home screen, so parents can access it easily without downloading an app.

This page includes short video guides and written instructions on the main features of the system, including notices, Daybook forms, absence notes, parent-teacher appointments, activities and reports.

Uniform and Appearance

Students should take pride in their school uniform. Any student found not to be in uniform, or whose appearance is judged to be unacceptable, may be kept out of class until the correct uniform is worn or until the general appearance has been addressed.

All students are expected to wear the correct school uniform, and parents must ensure that this is done.

Note: All items are badged with The English School colours and logos to achieve uniformity of colour and fabric. No items of uniform from other suppliers will be acceptable apart from shoes and trainers.

Sports Uniform

All new students will be informed of their Houses during Induction Day. Following this, students have one week to purchase the relevant sports uniform:

- The Nike School House shirt
- The Nike blue school shorts or black stretch shorts (for girls only)
- The blue school tracksuit
- Any good-quality trainers

Regulations

The following regulations apply to all students. All teaching staff are responsible for upholding the uniform policy. The policy is non-negotiable and applies equally to every student.

1. General Standards

- The highest standards of appearance—in dress, personal neatness and cleanliness—are expected of students at all times.
- Students who arrive improperly dressed or otherwise of unacceptable appearance may be sent to change, sent home or kept out of class until the matter is resolved.
- Full school uniform must be worn at all times during the school day, including during school visits and trips unless otherwise specified.
- All uniform items must carry The English School badge and be purchased from Classmates, with the exception of shoes and trainers.

2. Polo Shirt

- A white or blue school polo shirt must be worn at all times as the base layer of the uniform.
- The sweatshirt, fleece or jacket alone is not acceptable. Non-uniform items must not be visible or worn instead of the polo shirt under the sweatshirt or jacket.

3. Hair

- Hair must be neat, tidy and well maintained at all times.
- Extreme haircuts or brightly coloured hair are not permitted.
- Long hair must be kept clear of the face and must not obstruct vision at any time.
- In Science, D&T, PE, Art, and all other practical lessons, hair must be fully secured away from the face. Students whose hair cannot be tied back should discuss safe arrangements with their teacher.

4. Facial Hair

- Boys are expected to be either clean-shaven or to maintain facial hair that is clearly intentional, neatly groomed and trimmed.
- Unkempt facial hair is not acceptable.



Uniform and Appearance

5. Make-up

- Students in Years 1–3: no make-up is permitted.
- Students in Years 4–7: a light foundation or tinted moisturiser and clear lip balm only. Colour cosmetics, eye make-up, blush, contouring products and coloured lip products are not permitted in any year group.

6. Nails

- Coloured or neutral nail varnish is permitted. Coloured, glitter or decorative nail varnish is not permitted.
- Excessive long nails are not permitted on health and safety grounds.

7. Earrings

- Small, plain stud earrings may be worn. No hoop, dangling or oversized earrings are permitted.
- Earrings that could pose a health and safety risk must be removed for PE and all practical lessons.

8. Tattoos

- Tattoos – including temporary ones – must not be visible at any time.

9. Head Coverings

- Caps, hats, non-uniform school scarves, bandanas and berets are not permitted during the school day.
- Hoods may not be worn inside the school building at any time.
- Head coverings for verified religious or medical reasons are permitted with prior approval from the school.

Clothing — Length and Fit

- Trousers and pants must be hemmed and worn at or below the ankle.
- Shorts and skirts must not be altered or worn in a way that reduces their length.
- Tights (black, grey, navy, white or skin colour) may be worn.

Non-Uniform Items

- Non-uniform items are not permitted during the school day. This includes hoodies, non-school sweatshirts, pullovers, other jackets with hoods, and non-school T-shirts.
- School trip hoodies are not part of the official school uniform and may not be worn during the school day. They are welcome at non-uniform events and out-of-school activities.

Year 7 will be permitted to wear Year 7 T-shirts / hoodies solely at the discretion of the Head Teacher. Permission should first be obtained and the design must be pre-approved.

Sports Uniform

- Students are required to change into their PE uniform for physical education lessons and to change back into school uniform afterwards. PE uniform should be brought to school on days when it is needed.
- The following items are required for Physical Education and all sports activities:
 - Nike House shirt (school-badged)
 - Nike blue shorts (boys) / black stretch shorts or leggings (girls)
 - The English School tracksuit
 - Appropriate trainers

Note: If students have sports trainers which are not part of school uniform (e.g. all white, fluorescent), they should bring them to change into for PE / Games only.



Uniform and Appearance

Footwear

The school recognises that footwear needs have evolved. As an outdoor campus, smart trainers are now a permitted alternative to formal school shoes, subject to the rules below.

The following rules apply to all footwear worn on school premises:

- **Colour:** Footwear must be black or brown. No white, grey, red, or other colours are permitted.
- **Open toe or backless:** Not permitted. This includes flip flops, sandals, Crocs, mules, and slides.
- **Boots:** Plain black or brown ankle boots and UGG-style boots are permitted, provided they are black or brown. No coloured, patterned, or heavily decorated boots are allowed.
- **Trainers:** Plain black trainers are permitted. White detailing is allowed — for example, a white sole, white stripe, or white manufacturer logo — provided the trainer is predominantly black. The test is simple: if the shoe looks black, it is allowed; if it looks white or any other colour, it is not. White trainers with black detailing, predominantly white trainers, and trainers with coloured panels, logos, or soles (other than black or white) are not permitted. Where there is doubt, the decision of the staff member is final.

1. Pre-Term Communication

Before the start of each academic year, the Uniform Policy is circulated to all students and parents/guardians. Parents are required to confirm acceptance of the school's key policies — including this one — as part of a single annual declaration. Ignorance of the policy will not be accepted as grounds for non-compliance.

Note: Ignorance of the policy will not be accepted as grounds for non-compliance. By signing the declaration, both student and parent accept full responsibility for ensuring uniform requirements are met from the first day of term.

Readiness

The school liaises with the uniform supplier (Classmates) each year to ensure all required items and sizes are in stock before the start of term. Parents are advised to purchase or replace any missing or outgrown items before the school year begins. Outstanding uniform purchases are expected to be completed before the first day of term, not after it has started. Classmates offers a next-day online delivery service, making it straightforward to order items at short notice if needed.

Expectations from Day One

The uniform policy is a year-round commitment. Students are expected to be in correct, complete uniform from the first day of the academic year to the last — every day, every term, without exception.

On the first day of a new academic year only, staff may issue one verbal reminder. After this, and from the first day of any subsequent term, the consequences below apply without exception and without prior warning.

4. Consequences

The following consequences apply from the first instance of any uniform breach (after the Day 1 reminder period above):

Missing or Incorrect Wearable Item / Incorrect Footwear

For any uniform breach, whether a wearable item or footwear, the student is sent directly to the library and marked absent from lessons until they present in correct uniform. It is the student’s responsibility to contact their parent or guardian to arrange for the correct uniform to be brought to school, purchased from Classmates, or to go home and return in the correct uniform. The teacher sending the student to the library must inform the librarian by email. The attendance code will reflect “absent due to uniform” and counts as a formal absence. Staff do not debate this with students. The instruction is a directive, not a request.

5. Repeat Offenders and Aggravating Conduct

The following are treated as conduct matters and carry behaviour points:

- Repeated uniform breaches: any breach following the initial consequence in Section 4
- Insolence or disrespect: argument, insolence, or disrespect directed at a member of staff when questioned about uniform
- Circumventing the policy: wearing correct uniform for registration then changing; borrowing items to pass a check and returning them

First Instance

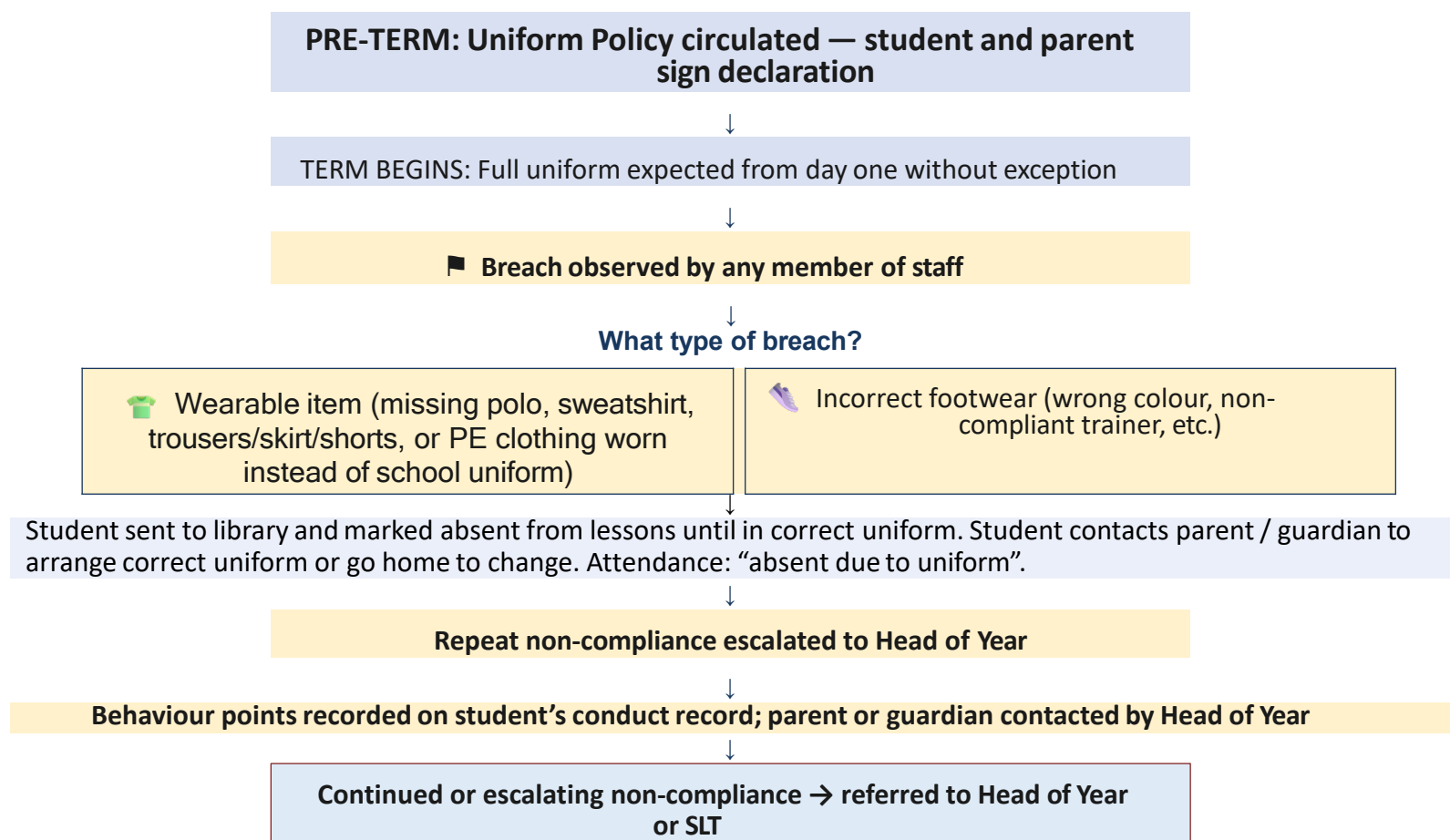
2 behaviour points are recorded on the student's conduct record.

Second and Subsequent Instances

2 further behaviour points are recorded and a call is made to the parent or guardian, with specific reference to the significance of the breach.

Enforcement Procedure

The school is committed to consistent, fair, and firm enforcement of the uniform policy. The procedure below applies to all students across all year groups. The policy is in force at all times, on all school premises, and during any school-supervised activity.

Attendance & Conduct Policy

- Regular attendance at meetings is mandatory. Students who miss three meetings per term without a valid reason may be removed from the council.
- Any breach of school policy or behaviour that discredits the school may result in indefinite suspension from leadership roles.



Maths Enrichment Programme

The Mathematics Enrichment Program, led by the Mathematics Department, is a specialized initiative designed for students who demonstrate exceptional mathematical ability and enthusiasm.

Sports Programme

Information Sheet: The English School Sports Programme

Introduction

The English School is proud to introduce the Sports Programme. This unique initiative is designed for students who exhibit exceptional talent and potential in sports, particularly those competing at the national level or with recognised developmental capabilities. The programme seamlessly integrates high-quality sports training with academic excellence, nurturing well-rounded student-athletes.

Objective

The Sports Programme aims to develop the skills and potential of young athletes without compromising their academic success. Through a balance of rigorous training and education, participants will be equipped to excel both on and off the field, preparing them for future leadership roles and achievements in their respective sports.

Key Features

1. Programme Structure:

- Five training sessions are incorporated into the school curriculum and scheduled from 7.00 – 8.45 am.
- Students will have seven and a half hours of training biweekly, during which they will miss Form Tutor time and Period 1.

2. Timetable Adjustments:

- For Year 1, training time will replace periods allocated for PE (3 periods) and PSHCE (2 periods) over two weeks.
- For Year 2 and 3, training time will be adjusted similarly, utilizing periods for PE, RE, and PSHCE.

3. Sports Offered:

- Core sports: Football, Basketball, Volleyball.
- Secondary sports: Tennis, Athletics.
- Elite athletes from other sports can express interest, and accommodations will be considered.

4. Participation Requirements:

- Students must represent the school in the relevant sports teams.
- Afternoon training at a registered club or academy is mandatory.

Selection Process

The selection process ensures that only the most talented and committed athletes join the programme.

Candidates must:

- Complete the Sports Programme section of the school application form.
- Provide documentation from their sports federation or club, detailing their achievements and rankings (where applicable) over the past 12 months. A reference letter from the athlete's coach would be welcome.
- Attend a practical evaluation session and/or an interview conducted by a team of Physical Education Teachers and Specialist Coaches.

Selection Criteria:

- Candidates must participate in an Olympic sport and belong to a federation-registered club or academy.
- Specific criteria apply for individual and team sports, focusing on recent performance in recognised competitions.

Why Join the Sports Programme?

- **Holistic Development:** The programme prioritizes both academic and athletic growth, offering a balanced and supportive environment for students.
- **Professional Guidance:** Expert coaches and physical education staff collaborate with the students' external trainers to optimise performance and development.

Physical Education & Afternoon Games

Afternoon Games is one of the long-standing traditions of The English School, aiming to provide further sporting opportunities to our students within our House system. Students are exposed to various sports and are supervised by the members of the PE Department and our Specialist Afternoon Games Coaches. They take part in multiple sports activities with younger and older boys and girls, under the guidance of their Head of House. Students can participate competitively in school sports by being selected to represent their House and they have the chance to develop into leaders, captaining their peers. Those who prefer a more relaxed, social and fun approach to sport may participate in non-competitive physical recreation activities, with emphasis placed on strengthening their friendships and improving their fitness.

Afternoon Games Activities

We have continued to develop and enrich the programme of activities that we offer to our students, working with a number of specialist coaches. Following feedback from students, we decided to maintain the activities that were introduced in past years, such as Brazilian Jiu Jitsu, Badminton and Archery. Of course, we will also continue to provide the “tried and tested” options of Basketball, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Softball, Athletics, Futsal, Hockey and Tennis.

Our aim is to continuously monitor the activities that we provide to ensure that a wide variety of quality sports opportunities are made available to our students. We would be happy to receive feedback from any student/parent on any aspect of the PE Department Afternoon Activities programme.

Afternoon Games Days and Times

Afternoon Games is a part of the school curriculum and students in years 1-3 are expected to attend on the relevant days and times.

Junior Boys Games: Thursdays: 2:10-3:30 p.m.

Junior Girls Games: Fridays: 2:10-3:30 p.m.

Students leaving the School site whilst waiting for Afternoon Games

Some students leave the School site in the time between the end of morning lessons and 2.10 p.m. when Afternoon Games begin. There are issues of safety involved but the School cannot prevent students leaving after the final bell for morning lessons nor can the School accept any responsibility for anything that may happen whilst students are off-site. There is no direct supervision of students during this time at School but there are always teachers around or other responsible adults who can help if the need arises. The School advises that students stay on the School site during this time for their own safety, since they have the option of using the School Canteen to buy food and drinks.

Changing Rooms and Personal Belongings

Students can use the changing rooms to change into their PE uniform for their sports lessons and Afternoon Games. A number of lockers are provided in the changing room corridor, where students can secure their valuables, using a small padlock of their own (preferably a combination lock). Following requests from students, we have decided to allow those who wish, to take their school and/or sports bags with them to the facility that they will be using for Afternoon Games, so that they can better monitor their own belongings.

Given that about 250 students will be participating in Afternoon Games each time, then everyone should take special care to look after their own belongings and valuables. The PE Department takes no responsibility for valuables that are not secured in the lockers.





Physical Education & Afternoon Games

Advice to Students

Students are encouraged to use sunscreen and a hat to protect themselves from the sun during Afternoon Games. Also, it is good practice for everyone to have a water bottle with them, as well as an extra T-shirt to change into at the end of their activity.

Absence from Afternoon Games

Afternoon Games is part of the school programme of students in years 1-3 and attendance is expected, as for all other parts of the curriculum. Students/Parents need to inform the School well in advance of any planned absences from Afternoon Games, to ensure the safety of our students. Please note that the same established procedures for leaving school early also apply to Afternoon Games.

- If a student needs to leave school early which involves them not attending Afternoon Games, then they need to make arrangements in the normal procedure, through the Main Office.
- If a student needs to leave school early because they are not feeling well, then they need to make arrangements with the School Nurse, preferably during one of the breaks. Please note that the School Nurse will be based in the Sports Centre PE Office during Afternoon Games.
- If a student is absent from Afternoon Games and no arrangements were made with the Main Office nor with the School Nurse in advance, then they will receive an “unjustified absence”. The consequence for an unjustified absence or truancy is detention together with 3 behaviour points issued to the student, in line with school policy.
- If a valid excuse is presented to the School after the student was absent from Afternoon Games, then the detention will be removed and 2 behaviour points will be issued for not making the required arrangements (for the student to be absent from Afternoon Games) in advance.

Medically Excused Students

Students who cannot participate in physical activity and have presented a valid medical certificate to the School Nurse, will be offered a non-physical option for Afternoon Games. Therefore, they will still be able and expected to participate in this part of the school programme under the supervision of one of our members of staff.

Cancellation of Afternoon Games due to the weather

A decision will be made as to whether Afternoon Games need to be cancelled due to weather conditions by 2nd break, so that students can inform their parents and make arrangements to leave school earlier.

School Team Practices and Sports Clubs Training Sessions

The PE Department offers a wide range of School Teams/Sports Clubs in a variety of sports, for all ages of the school: Basketball, Volleyball, Football, Athletics, Hockey, Cross-Country, Tennis, Table-Tennis, Handball, Weight Training, Parade, Brazilian Jiu Jitsu, Choreography and Futsal. Furthermore, we will provide opportunities to our students to represent the School in other sports such as Biathlon, Badminton, Gymnastics, Table-Tennis, Skiing and Swimming.

Our School Teams train regularly and participate in the Ministry of Education Competitions, as well as in a number of tournaments that are organised mostly by the Nicosia Private Schools. In recent years, our school teams have had numerous successes in many sports, both in the Ministry of Education as well as in other Nicosia and Pancyprian Competitions.
